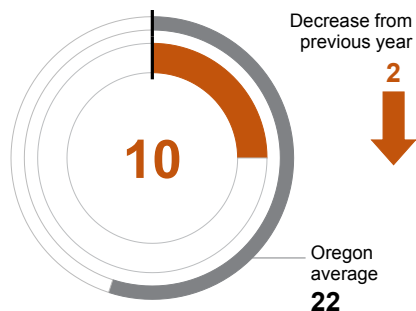

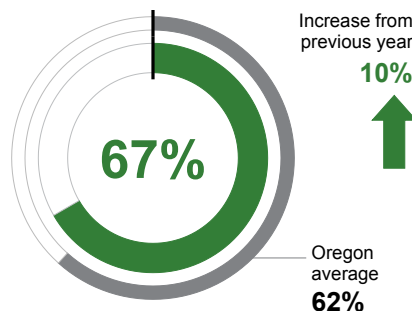
#### CLASS SIZE

#### REGULAR ATTENDERS

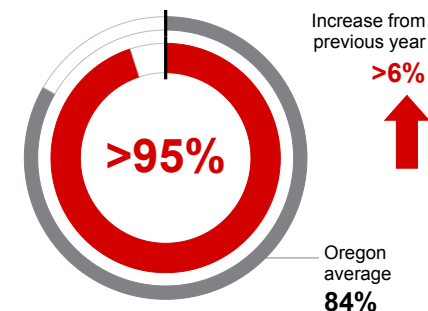

#### ON-TRACK TO GRADUATE

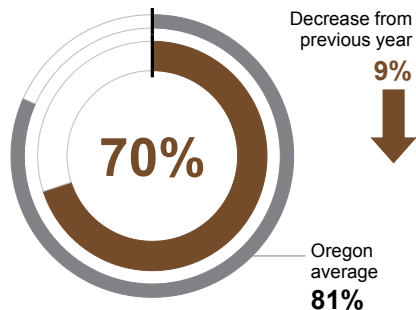

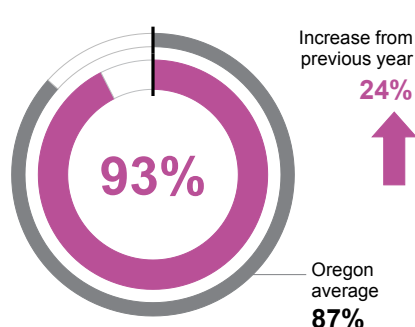
#### ON-TIME GRADUATION

Students earning a diploma within four years. Cohort includes students who were first-time ninth graders in 2018-19 graduating in 2021-22.



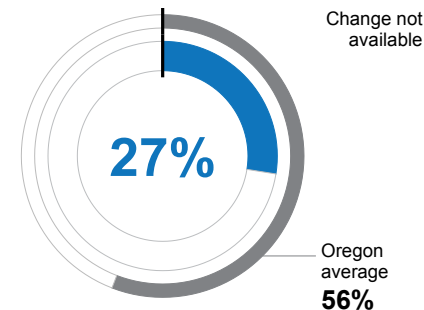
#### FIVE-YEAR COMPLETION

- \*To embrace our small school setting by preserving small class sizes and fostering strong relationships between the school, its students, families, and the community.
- \*To improve our use of student assessment data to provide a stronger individual intervention for our students.

### State Goals

The Oregon Department of Education is partnering with school districts and local communities to ensure a 90% on-time, four year graduation rate by 2027. To progress toward this goal, the state will prioritize efforts to improve attendance, provide a well-rounded education, invest in implementing culturally responsive practices, and promote continuous improvement to close opportunity and achievement gaps for historically and currently underserved students.

### Safe & Welcoming Environment

Our school promotes a sense of family from K-12. We train staff and students yearly in our Safety Response Protocol and Suicide Prevention Protocol. Our school policies and behavior programs emphasize the importance of avoiding bullying or harassment of any kind. Our campus is fenced around its exterior with only one primary point of entry through an instantly lockable door. We utilize a digital 2 way radio system as a backup for communicating to all staff and students in an emergency situation.
